### EMBLEM



On a disc divided diagonally from upper right to lower left by a thin white bar blue above and yellow below and encircled by a white border, a light blue globe grid lined white, overall a black and white hawk, beak and claws yellow, grasping a white pallet detailed and netted black; all within a narrow black border. Attached below the disc a red scroll bordered black and attached above the disc a red scroll bordered black inscribed THE PROFESSIONALS in black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of operations for the Air Force. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The bird grasping a pallet in its talons denotes the airlift mission of the unit. The globe indicates the Squadron's total commitment to a worldwide DOD transportation capability. The diagonal division of the blue and yellow background indicates around the clock movement of cargo and personnel. (Approved, 26 Jun 1986)
