Azure, on a bend nebuly Or between six billets in bend three and three of the like, two Cocks Gules, all within a diminished border Yellow. Attached below the shield, a White scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "70TH MISSION SUPPORT GROUP" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The cock is a bird of great courage and fortitude and is a symbol of watchfulness. He is always prepared for battle and is qualified to defend and protect his rights at all times. The nebuly line pattern represents clouds. The billets, symbols of vital information obtained when making air surveys and preliminary investigations vital in military strategic reconnaissance, reflect the Group's parent unit.
