EMBLEM



On a blue disc, a yellow cogwheel enclosing a light blue disc with a blue demi sphere issuant from base and overall a yellow eagle in flight grasping a silver gray cargo box with yellow bands; all within a narrow blue border. Attached above the disc a white scroll bordered blue and attached below the disc a white scroll bordered blue inscribed "FORCE BEHIND THE FORCE" in blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of operations for the Air Force. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The cogwheel indicates the transportation operation of the Squadron. The eagle and cargo box symbolize the mission of the Squadron: supporting the active duty aerial ports. The globe signifies that the Squadron goes wherever it is needed worldwide to support the active Air Force. (Approved, 12 Dec 1984)
