OPERATIONS

On 8 May 1955, the 6925th Radio Squadron Mobile activated at Clark Air Base, and the 29th RSM was inactivated. Under an administrative change of assignment, it was business as usual for squadron personnel as the 6925th assumed the 29th mission.

In early 1956, the 6925th Radio Squadron Mobile moved from the Stotsenberg Station area to a new location on Clark Air Base— into a new operations-communications building that became its permanent facility on Clark. The year 1956 also saw a major change in the USAFSS command structure.

The 6925th RSM at Clark Air Base was acquiring expanded capabilities to keep abreast of increased air activity in Southeast Asia. An addition to the 6925th operations building in 1959-1960 accommodated a gradual buildup in unit resources and tasking.

The 6925th had created a direction finding (DF) site (Det 1, 6925th RSM) at San Miguel City, Philippines, on 1 January 1962. The unit maintained the San Miguel DF station until April 1965.

With USAFSS relocating the 6922nd Security Wing to Clark Air Base in 1965, the 6925th Security Group was inactivated.
