OPERATIONS

The 7330th Motor Vehicle Squadron "Mobility on the ground leads to success in the air", has spearheaded the transportation advancements made since the Squadron activation at Furstenfeldbruck Air Base, Furstenfeldbruck, Germany. The original personnel were transferred from the 7365th Air Base Squadron, upon their in-activation. The Squadron under the command of Captain Lamar E. Naron began operating 1 November 1953 under 12th Air Force .General Order 91.

The mission of the 7330th Motor Vehicle Squadron (MDAP) is to provide motor transportation for all units of the 7330th Flying Training Wing (MDAP) and tenant units assigned to Furstenfeldbruck

Air Base. Operate a Wing Motor Patrol, schedule and dispatch vehicles, insure proper utilization of vehicles, and perform organizational and Field Maintenance on all Wing vehicles and vehicles assigned to tenant units.

With seventeen military and one-hundred-eighty-seven civilians assigned the Squadron, one of the largest of its type, found that the language barrier would be quite an obstacle, close co-operation between German and USAF military personnel overcame this problem.
