OPERATIONS

Students who are assigned to the 7330th Flying Training Wing (MDAP) report to this squadron. Upon reporting in, they are billeted, briefed, and given Physical examination. After two days of processing, students start academic and flying training. All students are rated pilots in their home country.

The MDAP students here for training are from Belgium, Denmark, France, Germany, Greece, Iran, Italy, Pakistan, Norway, Portugal, Spain, Turkey, The Netherlands, The United Kingdom and Yugoslavia. These international students have done well. Only thirteen have been eliminated prior to graduation. During the two years this organization has been in operation, some 1,050 MDAP students have graduated. In addition, many USAF non-jet qualified pilots have received Jet Familiarization Courses and tactical jet fighter pilots have received a Jet Instrument Course.

This squadron prepares the necessary pay vouchers for payment of per diem to the students. Also arranges for their transportation while on duty and upon return to their home country.

New problems and new situations are generally associated with this type of organization. During the processing of students, especially on a large scale when students are non-English speaking there is sometimes a language barrier problem. However, with calm planning and following past experiences, the mission is being carried out with satisfactory progress.
