EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, a triangle one point to base Or charged with a winged Staff of Aesculapius Argent, garnished of the first, between six mullets of the third. Attached above the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "86TH AMDS" in Blue letters. Attached below the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "KEEP 'EM FLYING" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The triangle reflects the support the unit provides to its parent organization. The winged Staff of Aesculapius symbolizes the Squadron's application of the medical profession to the aerospace mission of the Air Force. The stars allude to the six key elements required to maintain healthy aircrews. (Approved, 21 Oct 1998)
