EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, a pile Or, overall a pair of wings conjoined in lure Argent, surmounted by a sword point to base Silver Gray, grip detailed Sable, hand guard of the third, the pommel as a dollar sign within an annulet Vert; all within a narrow border Black. Attached below the disc, a Silver Gray scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "86TH COMPTROLLER SQUADRON" in Black letters. Attached above the disc, a Silver Gray scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "PROSPERITATES SACRIFICIUM" in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The pile signifies the sun with the sharp razor point representing the accuracy of the Squadron's deliveries and also denotes a stylized lightning bolt showing how rapidly the unit responds to any contingency. The sword with the dollar sign within an annulet as the pommel represents the importance of using money as a weapon system. The sword is winged, representing the airlift mission the unit supports.
