

EMBLEM



On a disc Gris, a knight's armor Azure, the helm plumed Gules, vented Argent, on the breast plate a globe of the field, axis bendwise, gridlined of the fourth, charged with a pair of wings displayed Or, surmounted by three arrows crossed, points up, one to dexter, one in pale, and one to sinister of the like, all within a narrow border Blue. Attached below the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "89TH AERIAL PORT SQUADRON" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The globe and arrows, Military Airlift Command symbols, indicate the parent organization and signify the unit's mission of loading passengers and freight on aircraft. The knight symbolizes the ancient citizen-soldier ready to serve his country in times of emergency.
