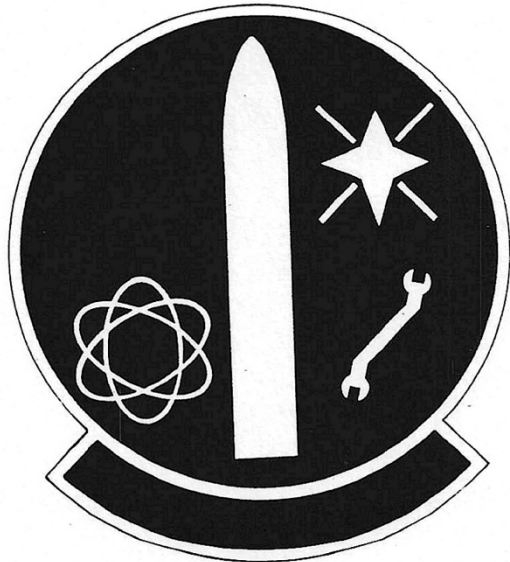

EMBLEM



91 Organizational Missile Maintenance Squadron emblem: On a blue disc edged with a narrow yellow border a white missile vertically centered between in the top of the disc a green wreath in dexter and a white four-pointed star emitting four white rays in sinister and in dexter base a yellow atom and in sinister base a diagonal red lightning bolt crossed by a white wrench, forming a saltire. Attached below the disc a blank blue scroll edged yellow. **SIGNIFICANCE:** The white missile symbol identifies a missile unit. The white crossed wrench and red lightning bolts represent the maintenance of the essential second-strike deterrent. The green olive wreath symbolizes the peace maintained through deterrence. The gold atom denotes the nuclear nature of the mission. The North Star represents the North Country location of the unit. The North Star is white. Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. (Approved, 4 Oct 1976)
