EMBLEM



92nd Aeromedical-Dental Squadron emblem: On a disc Celeste, a cross couped Gules charged with a Staff of Aesculapius, rod Brown, snake Or, all entoured by a bendwise sinister contrail of a double flight symbol descending bendwise sinister on the sinister arm of the cross Silver Gray, all within a diminished border Azure. Attached above the disc, a Light Blue scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "92d AEROMEDICAL DENTAL SQ "in Blue letters. Attached below the disc, a Light Blue scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "SANITAS VOLATUS" in Blue letters. Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The Staff of Aesculapius, on a red cross, symbolizes the medical-dental care provided by the unit to its parent command. The dual flight symbols suggest the air refueling operational mission of its parent command. (Approved, 3 Jun 1998)

Attached above the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "SANITAS VOLATUS" in Blue letters. Attached below the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "92D AEROSPACE MEDICINE SQ" in Blue letters. Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue represents the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The Staff of Aesculapius on a red cross symbolizes the medical care provided by the unit to its parent command. The dual flight symbols suggest the air refueling operational mission of the Squadron's parent command. The Latin motto "SANITAS VOLATUS" translates to "Health of the Flyer" in English.
