EMBLEM

The emblem is symbolic of the unit and the Air Force colors, ultramarine blue and golden yellow, as well as the National Colors, are used in the design. The color blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations, and yellow to the sun and excellence of personnel in assigned tasks. The old ordnance symbol designates the conventional munitions of the past and the present.

The stylized missile represents the special weapons and other modern weapons systems of this squadron. The crossed thunderbolt and olive branch symbolize our maintenance of power through munitions for the deterrence of hostility and the preservation of peace throughout the world and in near space. The stylized aircraft depicts the heavy bomber force standing constant vigil against any foe. The stars on the left and right designate the unit—92d Munitions Maintenance Squadron. On a blue disc edged with a narrow yellow border a black bomb enflamed yellow and red above a yellow lightning flash and a green olive branch in saltire, in sinister flank two white five-pointed stars one and one, in the top of the disc three stylized white aircraft in formation surmounting a yellow vapor trail arced to base between the stars and bomb and curving upward in dexter flank to terminate below a stylized white missile ascending; between the missile and aircraft a pattern of nine white five-pointed stars arced three, four and two. Attached below the disc a blank white scroll edged yellow. (Approved, 29 Jul 1974)
