

92 School Squadron emblem: The pilot cadet must take with him into training at the advanced flying school all of the fundamentals he has learned at ground school and primary instruction. Only then may he combine speed of ship and accuracy of gun fire into single action. He knows that it is not always luck that keeps him flying, but more often the application of the science of aerodynamics which draws that fine line of demarcation between a good flyer and a poor one—that feeling of the drag of the ship—the balance of the wings—the crushing weight of air, or its diminishing as the speed increases or lessens; all these figure importantly in the training of a potential seasoned flyer. The 92 School Squadron, one of five, training aviation cadets as pursuit pilots is located at Craig Field, Selma, Alabama. It is justly proud of its Disney wrought insignia, a large crow from the animated feature, "Dumbo." He is amusedly interested in the antics of a baby crow in its first attempts to fly.
