#### **OPERATIONS**

The Deputy Commander for Air Transportation, the third component of the tri-deputy system, provides passenger services for all the DV passengers and crew members transiting Andrews AFB. This Deputy also serves as the Commander of the 93rd Aerial Port Squadron. The incumbent is the single manager of all terminal services at Andrews. The 93rd has 100 personnel whose duties include support of Presidential travel, operation of a fixed terminal facility, and transportation and cargo support of local mobility plans. Some 1000 Code Q's and above (brigadier general up through the President) number among the nearly 12,000 passengers that use the services of the Andrews Passenger Terminal each month. The 93rd APS welcomes over 150 Heads of State, including the President of the United States at Andrews each year.

Support of Presidential activities alone keeps the 93rd busy. When the President travels, he is normally accompanied by 150 to 200 news media, communications, and security personnel. The Andrews terminal manifest all passengers as well as provides launch and recovery service for all support aircraft associated with the President's movement.
