96 Air Police Squadron



96th Security Forces Squadron emblem: On a disc parted per bend sinister Azure and Argent (Silver Gray), a terrestrial globe Proper, gridlined of the second, surmounted by a lance palewise Or, the point extending out of the field and overall, a demi-knight of the first detailed of the second, displaying a plume to sinister Gules, edged as the field, all within a narrow border Blue. Attached above the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "DEFENSOR MILITIS" in Blue letters. Attached below the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "96TH SECURITY FORCES SQUADRON" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The blue and gray divided sphere signifies day and night operations. The globe represents the unit's presence around the world. The knight on the globe represents the Air Armament Center, which is the parent unit.
