The first identified female members of the 107th Fighter Interceptor Group, New York Air National Guard, were commissioned officers (registered nurses) assigned to the 107th Tactical Hospital at Niagara Falls Air Base. 1st Lieutenant Frances O. Williams, a registered nurse with Manhattan General Hospital (Veteran's Administration), New York City, was commissioned as an officer into New York's Air National Guard in 1956; appointed as the Commander of the 8530th Air Reserve Squadron (ANG Nurses Training), Air National Guard Base at White Plains, New York, she was assigned to perform duties with the 107th Tactical Hospital, Lt, Williams was immediately followed by the commissioning of two additional nurses with the appointments of 1st Lieutenants Ada J. Monahan, of Attica, New York, and Mary Bordanaro, a Buffalo based nurse.
