EMBLEM



The three main symbols of the design are, the falcon, the lightning bolts, and the globe. The falcon represents the group. The pairs of lightning bolts being grasped by the falcon's claws, symbolize information in the form of communications being grasped and controlled by the organization. The additional lightning bolts represent the 1912th Computer Systems Group disseminating information through lines of communications to other groups and squadrons around the world which is symbolized by the globe.
