EMBLEM



Or, a demi-sphere issuing from base Azure gridlined of the first, overall a falcon stooping affronté, Gold Brown detailed Brown, beak, talons and legs Yellow grasping in each respective talon a lightning bolt issuant from dexter and sinister fesswise Gules and emitting therefrom four lightning bolts to base two in pale between to chevronwise of the like, all within a diminished bordure Or. Attached below the shield a White scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "ACC COMMUNICATIONS GROUP" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE**: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The falcon represents the unit. The lightning bolts in the falcon's claws signify information being received and transmitted. The globe represents the worldwide dissemination of information.
