Air Reserve Personnel Center emblem BLAZON: Celeste, in base a globe vert gridlined Or charged at the pole with a mullet Argent bearing a torteau, issuant from the globe two arrows arced chevronwise of the third garnished Azure the dexter supporting a stylized male figure and the sinister a stylized female figure all below four arced contrails yellow terminating at a flight symbol Gules both ascending pilewise between four mullets white chevronwise reversed, all within a diminished bordure Gold. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The star on the globe denote the Center and its worldwide activities. The stylized human figures on arching arrows signify the Center's management of Reserve personnel. The aircraft reflects the mission of those personnel within the Air Force. The five stars symbolize the five mobilizations in which the Air Force Personnel Center has been involved.
