## EMBLEM

The lamp with flame signifies the knowledge provided through automatic data processing services the organization makes available to its customers to expand customer knowledge. The stack of coins signifies a fee-for-service agency that actually charges other agencies for its services. It is reimbursed for services provided by authority of the Air Force. This is a unique method for providing support in the public sector. By charging for its services, the Computer Services Center instills in its customers an awareness of the cost of ADP and the initiative to employ CSC services cost effectively. The computer terminal is a symbol of automatic data processing services which the organization provides to its customers. It typifies the "time-sharing" or remote processing that the center supports. The human figure represents all customers, who are in actuality United States Government agencies. Although automation support necessarily involve machines, it is people who have problems to solve and people who benefit from the services the center provides.

1 November 1986 Redesignated 2d Computer Systems Group

1 March 1989 Assigned to Standard Systems Center (SSC)

1 July 1989 Redesignated Computer Services Center (CPSC). Relieved from assignment to Standard Systems Center and assigned to Computer Systems Division (CSD)
