OPERATIONS

Metz-Frescaty is located in the Moselle Department, 190 miles (305 km) east of Paris and 1 mile (2 km) east of Autoroute A31 on Department Road D5. The Metz-Frescaty Sub-Depot, property #2684, was located on a WWII airdrome (ALG Y-34) near the southwest edge of Metz.

The site, originally planned for an interim air base, was later developed into a sub-depot and used by the USAFE for vehicle storage and Project SEAWEED war material storage. Flight "B" 73rd Warehouse Sq, Depot, was activated in 1951 at Chateauroux AD and moved to Metz-Frescaty Airport to store the supplies and vehicles being shipped in from CONUS. By the fall of

1952, vehicle storage moved to Moulins Sub-Depot. All SEAWEED supplies were relocated to several main air bases and stored in base supply warehouses as they were completed. Frequent inventory control reports had to be prepared for HQ USAF by each base for Project SEAWEED material. Metz-Frescaty was turned over to the U.S. Army as an airfield for a fixed wing aviation unit.
