OPERATIONS

Members of the 218 Engineering Installation Squadron erect one of a pair of 48-foot antenna towers at the 1842 Electronics Engineering Group's home at Scott AFB, Illinois. The equipment is part of the Meteor Burst communications testbed. Meteor Burst technology uses the trails of ionized electrons created when billions of meteorites enter the earth's atmosphere and burn up. These trails can be used to act as a propagation medium for very high frequency radio energy, with data transmitted in bursts being reflected by the electron trails to be picked up by a distant station.
